

We can visit any search engine and type “Ubuntu Server” and we will see several links that will take us to their download web page.

The default server on the Ubuntu download web page is the 64 bit version. To obtain that copy, we just press the Start download button.



# Save the Ubuntu Server ISO

Then we save the Ubuntu Server ISO image to our computer and it can take several minutes to an hour depending on our Internet speed.





# The 32 bit Ubuntu Server Version

If we have an older computer, we will probably want the 32 bit version. Pick this flavor from their list box and start the download. Again, it will take several minutes or hours to download the ISO image.




# Write Ubuntu Server to DVD

We will use ImgBurn to write the Ubuntu image to DVD. We select Write image file to disc.




# Selecting the Source

We pick the yellow icon to the right of Source and pick the downloaded Ubuntu Server ISO file. We place a disk in the DVD RW tray and we select the Disc icon to begin the process.




# Burn the Server Image

The Ubuntu Server is just over 700,000 bytes and only takes a few minutes to burn the image to disc.



# Server Disc is Complete

When the server disc is complete, we press the OK button.



# Burn more Discs

We can place another blank DVD in the tray and burn another 64 bit Ubuntu server disc. Or we can close the program and install Ubuntu Server.
